TPWD Symposium News / Possible Neches River Dam

TPWD Symposium News

At our last meeting, our environmental chair, Ken Lock, discussed the happenings at the recent Texas Parks and Wildlife Department symposium called "Up a Creek without a Paddle, The Future of Water/River-Based Recreation in Texas." This symposium was hosted by TPWD in San Marcos.

In this symposium, there was a proposal presented for boat registration, canoes and kayaks included, per year per boat. Summary of symposium highlights:

Changing Constituent Base/River Strategy—Aging anglers, and the fact that when they raise the fishing license fees the participation declined.

Water Management—Some Colorado River usage stats and that there is an opportunity for membership on the LCRA Advisory Board.

Access/Trespass Considerations— Senate Bill 1 changed water planning in Texas from a technical operation to a social planning process. This provides a new influence opportunity by recreation and environmental advocates. Guadalupe River Flow Issues—Has no

Guadalupe River Flow Issues—Has no planned new reservoirs, test wells are below 1950s levels.

Blanco River Access/Trespass Issues— There was an advocacy of lease arrangements with private landowners by interested groups such as paddling clubs.

River Strategy Plan—Registering canoes and kayaks: a Sunset Commission Report contained a recommendation to expand the boat registration fee to canoes, kayaks and rowboats. They estimated 1.7 Mill in revenue, however, TPWD did not include this item in their recommendations to the legislature, but they are laying the groundwork for the future. The fee model they offered: Pri-

vate boaters would pay \$10 plus \$2 per boat up to 5 boats, then another \$10/\$2 for the next 5 boats. You would get a sticker or decal-not the powerboat numbers—and the sticker would be good for two years. Liveries would pay \$50 plus \$2 per boat. Dealers would have to pay a "dealers tag" to use on demo boats. Non-profits would pay only \$2 per boat. They would use the current powerboat registration infrastructure to sell the stickers. They claim that this would produce a nominal 3M per biennium. It would be used exclusively for paddling related purposes. 1M for access, .5M for Law Enforcement, .5M for landowner incentives (access), .5M for local grant to paddling groups, .5M for administration. They say the reason for the fees are a drop in revenue.

Proposed Rockland Dam—Neches River

The Neches River may be dammed! The priceless gem, the Neches River, is one of the last remaining, essentially free-flowing rivers in the state of Texas, but will disappear forever if the water hustlers and dam builders have their way. These groups are laying the political groundwork for the giant Rockland Dam Reservoir (160,000 acres), along with two additional impoundments on the Neches River. Should their efforts prove successful, this wild treasure would vanish along with some 197 square miles of forest above the dam and 218 square miles of forest below the dam. The dam would exterminate the food supply of thousands of birds and animals that depend

upon the river's hardwood trees for nesting and food. In essence, it would wipe out the entire Neches River Valley biological corridor, including the Sabine Pass estuaries.

In 1999, the TPWD deemed the Neches River as ecologically significant for its overall habitat value, exceptional aquatic life (home to several threatened fish species), and valuable hydrologic

function performance. For years there have been calls to designate the Neches as a "National Wild and Scenic River." The wild and scenic designation would preserve what remains of the river's verdant bottomlands, wildlife, and shadowed forest for present and future generations.

Main arguments against the Rockland Dam:

East Texas doesn't need the water! Houston doesn't need the water either (The dam is for Region H [Houston], but Region H doesn't want to buy the water).

To Blair's Landing:

Turn off Hwy 43 (right), at the Caddo Lake State Park Road, FM 2198. Go past the park and stay on FM 2198 towards Uncertain. Turn left on Mound Pond Road and follow it to its end where you will find Blair's Landing.

To Pine Needle Lodge:

Continue on Hwy 43 past the state park turnoff, cross the bayou bridge and turn right on the next real road Hwy 805. Continue until the pavement ends and bear right to Pine Needle Lodge. As you go through the gate, notice parking on both sides of road. Boat ramp is at the end. Unload your vehicle and move it quickly as space at the boat ramp is

at a premium. There is a \$2.00 per day vehicle charge payable to the Bennicks, owner of Pine Needle Lodge.

Canoes can be rented from Mountain Sports in Arlington (Bill Anton 817-461-4503), High Trails in Garland (Bob Narramore 972-272-3353), North Texas Canoes in Carrollton (Rich Manning 972-245-7475), or Pine Needle Lodge on Caddo Lake (Bennicks 903-665-2911).


