Meet DDRC Members

If you are interested in telling us about yourself. Send whatever information you would like share about yourself (where and what you paddle, the kids, the dog, where you live, how you pay for your paddling habit, etc.) to me via email preferably with a picture so we'll all know who you are.

As a participant in any DDRC activity, an individual assumes the responsibility of evaluating all inherent risks before participating and assumes any risk of death or injury inherent in the sport. The participant waives claims that may arise against the club, its officers, members, servants, agents and/or trip coordinators, for death or injury to person or property, including claims of vicarious liability and claims arising from civil recklessness or any degree of negligence. Not waived are claims against an individual who causes injury intentionally or with criminal recklessness and claims among driver, owner and passengers of a motor vehicle for injuries.

Safety Tips on Personal Information

A corporate attorney sent the following out to the employees in his company:

The next time you order checks have only your initials (instead of first name) and last name put on them. If someone takes your check book they will not know if you sign your checks with just your initials or your first name but your bank will know how you sign your checks.

When you are writing checks to pay on your credit card accounts, DO NOT put the complete account number on the "For" line. Instead, just put the last four numbers. The credit card company knows the rest of the number and anyone who might be handling your check as it passes through all the check processing channels won't have access to it.

Put your work phone # on your checks instead of your home phone. If you have a PO Box use that instead of your home address. If you do not have a PO Box use your work address.

Never have your SS# printed on your checks (DUH!) you can add it if it is necessary. But if you have it printed, anyone can get it.

Place the contents of your wallet on a photocopy machine, do both sides of each license, credit card, etc. You will know what you had in your wallet and all of the account numbers and phone numbers to call and cancel. Keep the photocopy in a safe place. I also carry a photocopy of my passport when I travel either here or abroad.

We've all heard horror stories about fraud that's committed on us in stealing a name, address, Social Security number, credit cards, etc. Unfortunately I, an attorney, have firsthand knowledge because my wallet was stolen last month. Within a week, the thieve(s) ordered an expensive monthly cell phone package, applied for a VISA credit card, had a credit line approved to buy a Gateway computer, received a PIN number from DMV to change my driving record information online, and more.

But here's some critical information to limit the damage in case this happens to you or someone you know:

We have been told we should cancel our credit cards immediately. But the key is having the toll free numbers and your card numbers handy so you know whom to call. Keep those where you can find them easily.

File a police report immediately in the jurisdiction where it was stolen, this proves to credit providers you were diligent, and is a first step toward an investigation (if there ever is one).

But here's what is perhaps most important: (I never even thought to do this).

SAFETY

Call the three national credit reporting organizations immediately to place a fraud alert on your name and Social Security number. I had never heard of doing that until advised by a bank that called to tell me an application for credit was made over the Internet in my name. The alert means any company that checks your credit knows your information was stolen and they have to contact you by phone to authorize new credit. By the time I was advised to do this, almost two weeks after the theft, all the damage had been done. There are records of all the credit checks initiated by the thieves' purchases, none of which I knew about before placing the alert. Since then, no additional damage has been done, and the thieves threw my wallet away this weekend (someone turned it in). It seems to have stopped them in their tracks.

River Report

The Kiamichi River

Last spring, I was surfing the web looking for vacation cabins in Oklahoma and stumbled on the K River Campground website. There were pictures of a campground and people paddling on the Kiamichi River near Antlers, Ok. The Kiamichi? never heard of it, never heard anyone talk about it, so I thought I would check it out. I looked in Rivers and Rapids, nothing there. I found a few references to some class II whitewater and some GPS coordinates for the put in and a take out on a whitewater site, but not much else. Frustrated, I gave up searching.

A few months later while on a weekend trip to the Illinois River, John Pullman mentioned that an old buddy of his lived in Antlers. He said it was fairly remote and mostly undeveloped, but really pretty country. When I got back home, I looked up the K River site again. There were some new pictures of the river and it looked pretty good. I looked Antlers up on the map and found that it was only about 160 miles from Dallas. That's a lot closer than some of the other rivers we paddle, I thought, but folks didn't seem too excited about heading up there to check it out. Over last Thanksgiving weekend a small brave group consisting of Pat Chamberlain, Fraser Border, Gail Shipley and myself decided to check it out. I think for the most part we were pleasantly surprised.

The K River Campground has been open for about a year and is still being developed. Similar to Peyton's Place on the Illinois River, it has plenty of open area for groups, as well as RV sites, a fishing pond, plenty of river frontage and since the place is still being cleared, tons of firewood. The firewood was especially nice since both nights we were there the temperature was well below freezing. K River's Owner, Tom Garrett, intends to add more RV sites and tent sites this year. He is also planning an expansion of the restrooms/bathhouse. Tom also rents canoes and is expanding his fleet to include some kayaks for the spring. Something else Tom has in abundance is peace and quiet. There are only about three homes in the immediate area and the campground is well off the main road. On clear nights, the stargazing was great too.

Until K River opened, access to the river was limited. Using the campground as the take out, trips of 8 and 12 miles or longer can be set up by putting in at various points along OK2, which runs pretty much parallel to the river for around 30 miles. The put ins are steep and parking is limited but K River has a small bus and a trailer for shuttling. The river itself is a combination of pools and drops as it comes down out of the Kiamichi Mountains. While most of the river on the 12 or so miles above the campground is flat water with a moderate current and few swift spots similar to the Illinois, there are a few rock gardens and chutes that are Class I when the flow is right. I paddled this stretch in mid February at about 850 cfs and found it to be a lot of fun and free of any major obstacles. At higher flows, some of the rock gardens form standing waves. There are areas of more serious whitewater upriver, but I have not yet scouted it. I counted 4 visible houses on this stretch of the river, so the scenery is great and there is plenty of wildlife too. Deer, coyotes, wild pigs, and all sorts of birds were present as well as lots of cattle. The river had plenty of gravel bars for picnics or possibly overnight camping. Tom says that people have done extended trips down the river lasting two or three days.

Overall, the area has some real potential. It's close to Dallas, the river is fun, the campground is convenient and the folks that run it are really friendly. You owe it to yourself to add this one to your list of places to check out.

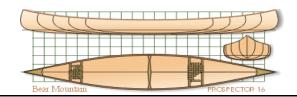
